No one could ever say that at St Michael's we lay idle, procrastinate or are lazy! There is always something on the burner!

Firstly to those mothers, grandmas, aunts, family members and friends that were able to join us for our Mother's Day Liturgy, thank you for 'snatching' and 'seizing' a moment and sharing with us such a special celebration! For those unable to join us, you were with us in spirit and most certainly in our prayers! With children we all know how precious little moments are, so we pray that you were able to share and cherish some 'moments' with your families on Mother's Day!

Our brilliant Year 3 and Year 5 students started their NAPLAN testing today with Language Conventions and Writing and will continue over the next two days with Reading and Numeracy! We thank their teachers and parents for the preparations that have taken place to ensure the students approach these days with confidence and a sense of calm.

Over the coming weeks our Kindergarten teachers will undertake the Australian Early Development Census, which is an Australian Government Initiative which measures the developmental progress of children as they start their first year of full time schooling. The Census looks at groups of children in the community, not individuals. Further information will be sent home to the parents of our Kindergarten students over the next few weeks.

Finally, of course the learning continues everyday in our learning spaces. At the end of this term we will be sending home portfolios and reports and meeting with you to further discuss your child's progress. Although this is a formal opportunity we also welcome you to discuss your child's needs at any time with their teacher. Please understand that once the children have lined up and are walking into school, the teachers are unable to discuss the needs of students.

We only ask that you make appointments with the class teacher, either through the office, via a note in the note folder or after school.

“My commandment: Love one another”

IF YOU WISHED to sum up the Christian faith in one phrase it would surely be the words we hear uttered by Jesus in this weekend's Gospel: “Love one another.”

But what did Jesus mean when he commanded us to “love one another”? The word “love” can mean so many different things depending on the context in which it is used. As always, Jesus draws us into a radical understanding and living out of love. It is not a mere feeling, it is not romance, it is not simply something “nice”. The best indicator we get of what Jesus means by love is surely right there in the way he commands us to love. If the love he was speaking of was a feeling, then it could not be commanded. We cannot command another person, or ourselves, to feel something. Feelings are beyond our control. Feelings precede action, over which we do have control. The love of which Jesus speaks therefore, is clearly a love which has its foundation in a choice on our part and which requires action by us. The love he speaks of, quite simply, is made evident in his own life during his time on earth.

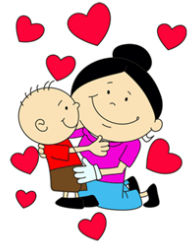

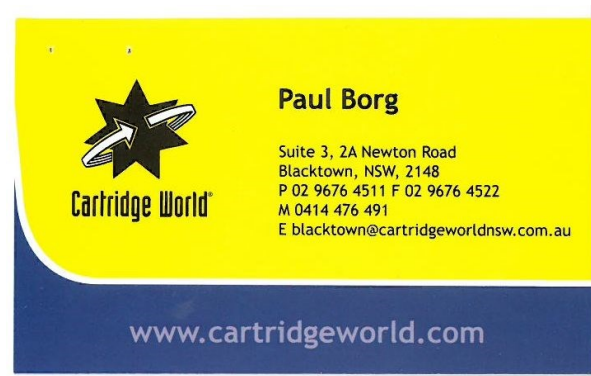
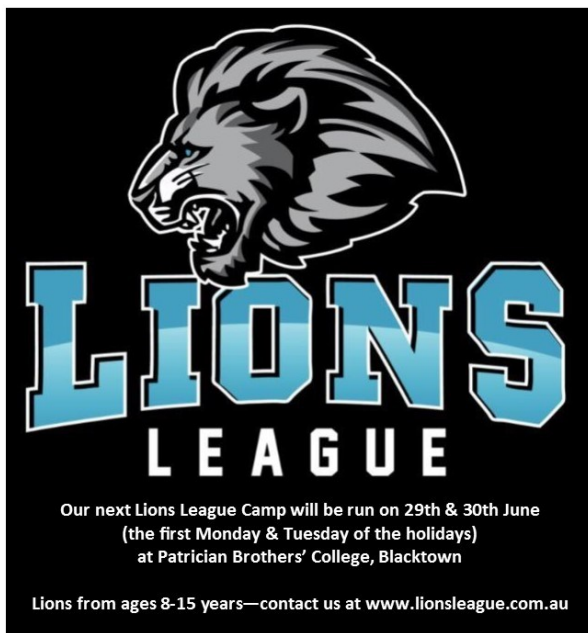
