Dear Parents & Friends,

Last Friday's Staff Development Day was a definite step in our school community moving from **Good to Great**. Our leading learner for the day was Mrs Cheri Baddock and our Curriculum Team.

The days focus was **Understanding By Design**. Understanding By Design ("UBD") supports our own shared pedagogy that states:

"Teaching and learning experiences are to promote active learning and deep understanding which caters for individual needs and learning."

UBD requires us to think of "The Big Idea" that we want to explore with our children. This BIG IDEA is less about content ie memorized facts and more about how thinking and understanding will change.

And so, UBD, challenges us to provide learning experiences that will promote learning which will pass beyond the classroom eg:

- ◆ Are we still under the influence of the first Gold Rush?
- ◆ Is the Assylum Seekers issue proof that Democracy isn't working?
- ◆ Do all machines make life better?

These questions ensure that the **BIG IDEA** will:-

- ◆ Have many layers and nuances.
- ◆ Yield optimal depth of insight.

UBD is an exciting approach to teaching and learning ensuring that: ***"All students almost all the time exhibit higher order thinking"*** and again from our Pedagogy:

"That all students at St Michael's are engaged in activities that promote positive independence that are linked to life experiences"

At the end of our day each grade had completed a sizeable chunk of their thinking and planning for Term 3.

I sincerely congratulate my colleague teachers on their high levels of professionalism, energy and, yes, Deep Thinking.

RE NEWS

Sunday was the feast of Pentecost which celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and were recalled in this week's first reading. The gospel used on Sunday is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were slow to understand the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being 'filled with the Spirit'. It is this Spirit with which he was filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation.

When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world.

Thank you to all who supported our mufti day last week. We raised over \$800 which will be used to purchase blankets to be given to St Vincent de Paul Society as part of our Sacred Heart Mass on Friday 1st July.

MOBILE MUSTER

Do you have a drawer full of old mobile phones? We can help you!! In coming weeks St Michael's will take part in a **MOBILE MUSTER** where you can recycle your old mobile phones.

MobileMuster is the official recycling program of the mobile phone industry.

Initiated voluntarily by the Australian telecommunications industry in 1999, its overall aim is to prevent mobile phones ending up in landfill.

The program collects and recycles mobile phone handsets, batteries and accessories from a network of over 3,500 mobile phone retailers, local councils, government agencies and business drop off points across Australia.

MobileMuster is giving our school the opportunity to help our environment and at the same time receive some fantastic rewards for schools and students by simply rounding up and handing in old and unused mobile phones, batteries, chargers and accessories.

Did you know that if Australians handed in the 14-16 million unused or broken mobile phones hidden in desks and drawers across the country you could make:

- ◆ • 160,000 plastic fence posts (enough to build a fence from Sydney to Melbourne)
- ◆ • 31,000 gold wedding bands
- ◆ • 3.2 million Aluminium cans

Plus 13,867 tonnes future greenhouse gas emissions will be avoided which is equal to planting 84,000 trees, or taking 5,180 cars permanently off the road.

The more points our school receives, the more veggie patch equipment we can redeem.


