
From the Assistant Principal

Dance-a-thon

We have had a very busy and exciting term at St Michael's. We want to thank and congratulate you for raising \$18,284.65 for our dance-athon. The money raised will go to reading resources and looking at ways to improve our infants playground.

On Friday at 2pm we will have our prize assembly where the top fundraiser in the school will win an iPad, the top fundraiser in each class will win a movie ticket and every \$5 raised children will get a ticket into the draw to win many other prizes.



Attendance

As the term ends it is a good opportunity to reflect on how many days your child has been absent so far. You would have seen this total on your child's school report.

Currently there are **70 children** who have a **80%-90% attendance rate** which means they have missed between 10-18 days off. We class this as an **emerging attendance problem.**

There are **10 children** who have a **70-80% attendance rate** which means they have missed between 19-26 days off. We class this as a **chronic attendance problem.**




There are **4 children** who have less than **70% attendance** rate which means they have had between 28-50 days off. We class this as a **complex attendance problem.**

Attendance at school is a **legal responsibility of parents** and it does impact on learning gains. Please ensure holidays are planned outside of school time and that children are at school all the time unless they are sick. If you are having trouble getting your child to school please contact their class teacher or myself and we can support you.

Holiday reading

The children have been making wonderful gains in their reading. It is important that the children continue to read in the holidays to maintain this growth. You could go to the local library to borrow books if you need some books for home.

RE News

The first thing that is striking about next Sunday's gospel passage is the fact that there are 72 disciples whom Jesus sends out on mission. We can have an image of Jesus strolling around Galilee with just a small group of followers but this passage makes it clear that a significant number of people were engaged in his ministry. This sending out to mission is a significant element of the gospel of Luke.

Another theme that is significant in the gospel of Luke is the message of hospitality. Jesus teaches on it frequently and tries to convey a message that the hospitality of God is available to all. In the sending of the disciples, Jesus tells them to take nothing with them for the journey. He is telling them to rely on the hospitality of strangers. If they are welcomed and shown hospitality then they are to bless the household and carry out their ministry. The ability to show hospitality to the messengers of God is a sign that the household will welcome the message of God. However, wherever they do not receive hospitality they are to leave the town, shaking the dust from their feet, as their ministry will not be welcomed by people who are not ready to hear it. It is an excellent message about not wasting your efforts in unproductive ways – not hitting your head against a brick wall!

The gospel passage immediately follows the passage used last week that spelt out the difficulties of discipleship. Having explained how hard it is to be a disciple, Jesus sends his followers out to 'have a go' at being a disciple. When they come back successful he tells them not to be boastful or proud at their achievements but rather to be happy that their 'names are written in heaven'. In other words, anything they accomplished was because they were 'known' by God and that God was working through them. Disciples make themselves 'known' to God and God works through them to accomplish great things! How good would it be if we were all disciples with God working through us.

I hope everyone has a restful holiday.
