Last week our Staff Development Day had as its focus, *Positive Behaviours for All.* At St. Michael's we support the needs of 750 children, each child brings a varying degree of need in maintaining *equilibrium*.

Our task in supporting the needs of each and every child requires of us a *deep understanding* of our children's needs and a willingness to create *relationships*.

Behaviour needs to be taught in the same way that we teach other areas in the curriculum:

- Teach
- Model

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- Practice
- Praise

Behaviour support is the **redesign of environments** not the **redesign of individuals.** 

At St. Michael's we aim to maintain a *Positive School For All* by ensuring:

- Common purpose and approach to discipline.
- Clear set of positive expectations and behaviours.
- Procedures for teaching expected behaviours.
- Continuum of procedures for encouraging expected behaviour.
- Procedures for monitoring of data and evaluations.
- Involvement of all stakeholders.

I believe with these clear directions and an unwavering commitment to living out our motto to "Love One Another", our school will always be a *safe school*.

#### SPEECH THERAPISTS and OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS:

#### PARLIAMENT AND CIVICS EDUCATION REBATE (PACER) - Year 6 Canberra Excursion



The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$20.00 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate was paid directly to our school upon completion of the excursion.
